A BILL

BILL HISTORY

This legislation has been initiated due to obvious student, staff and faculty concern in regards to Career Services' allowance of use of their facilities for outside employment recruiters.

BILL SUMMARY

This Bill shall endorse the petition being circulated by the organization, Community in Action, that requests the University of Colorado develop a democratically appointed panel consisting of students, staff, faculty and administrators (appointed by the respective representative body) to develop a policy for the use of Career Services by outside employment recruiters.

BE IT ENACTED by the Executive Council of the University of Colorado Student Union THAT:

SECTION 1: UCSU requests the University of Colorado, as an institution, formally investigate and establish an explicit set of ethical principles to govern the use of its facilities by external agencies for purposes of recruitment. Once these policies are established we request that the CIA be the first case the board considers.

SECTION 2: The University of Colorado respects all First Amendment rights on our campus, including freedoms of speech of all speakers. However, the use of University facilities for recruitment by external agencies is not a First Amendment right.

SECTION 3: UCSU requests that this board consist of three students, three staff, three faculty and three administrators, appointed by the respective representative boards.

SECTION 4: UCSU believes that the University must take a position in regards to this one way or another, as this is obviously an issue that the University Community is concerned about.

SECTION 5: Upon passage, the President Pro-Tempore shall write a letter to President Gee, Chancellor Baughn, Vice Chancellor Howe, and Career Services, in support of the petition.

SECTION 6: This legislation takes effect upon passage.
