SECTION 1: UCSU strongly encourages Curtis Caton to visit Boulder

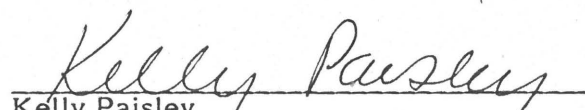

SECTION 1: We, as the students of the University of Colorado, recognize the need to address this issue.

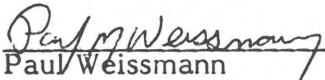
SECTION 2: The UCSU commend the Pro-Peace Organization in its effort to educate, inspire and involve the citizens of the U.S. and the world in this critical issue.

WHEREAS: The GAP at Crossroads Mall donated over 300 fluorescent lightbulbs of the type they previously used to the UMC; and

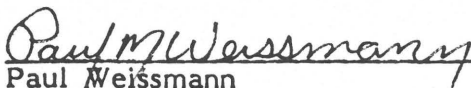
WHEREAS: These lightbulbs are valued at approximately \$900;

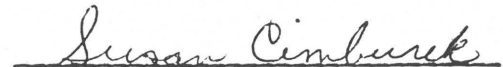

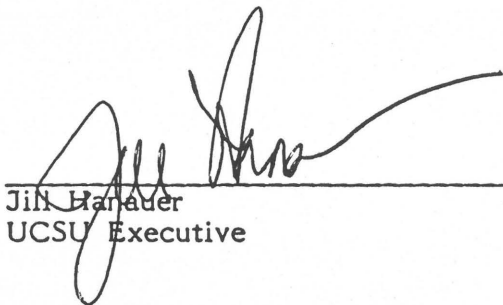

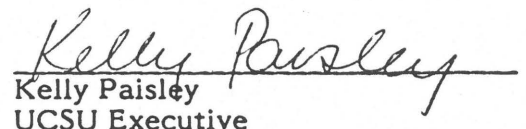

WHEREAS: The student run Recreation Center is open 10 hours per week longer than the library;

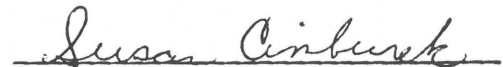
THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Executive Council of the University of Colorado Student Union, THAT:

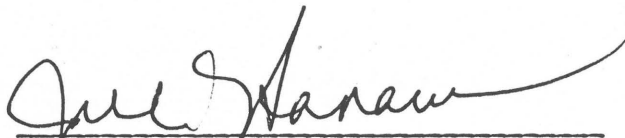
Section 1: The University of Colorado Student Union officially challenges the Administration to keep Norlin Library open for at least as many hours as the Recreation Center.

WHEREAS:The station is costing the students on this campus approximately \$50,000.00 per year and UCSU should be making every attempt to deliver this service to the students;

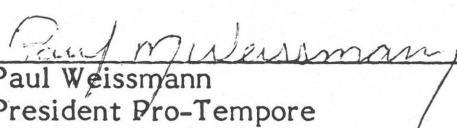
THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Executive Council of the University of Colorado Student Union THAT:

This booth would be located somewhere close to the food court. The cables from the station would be extended to reach this booth and a communication line from KAIR and the booth would also be included. Installation of the aforementioned will be the responsibility of the radio station.

SECTION 2: The UMC Board shall include in its renovation audio monitors broadcasting KAIR in the food court and adjacent areas.
