BILL HISTORY

In an effort to provide an alternative to parties involving alcohol, a "dry" 50's dance will be held in the Glenn Miller Ballroom on Saturday, November 8. The slogan for this dance will be "THE PARTY: NO BOOZE, JUST FUN." Refreshments will be served, through an old-fashioned malt/soda fountain shop. A disc jockey will serve up the music of the 50's, while everyone dances the night away.

The dance, presented by Campus Crusade for Christ, will be open to all students, with attendance expected to reach 1,000.

BILL SUMMARY

This Bill allocates \$1,066.92 towards the advertisement expenses of the non-alcoholic 50's dance in the Campus Press and the Colorado Daily.

BE IT ENACTED by the Executive Council of the University of Colorado Student Union, THAT:

- SECTION 1: An amount not to exceed \$1,066.92 be allocated from Central Reserve to fund advertising in the Campus Press and the Colorado Daily.
- SECTION 2: No admission will be charged.
- SECTION 3: In the advertising, the name of Campus Crusade for Christ shall appear graphically and physically equal to that of all other sponsors.
- SECTION 4: Campus Crusade for Christ shall make no announcements or engage in any other promotional activities during the dance.
- SECTION 5: A written report about the event shall be submitted pursuant to the provisions of 24 ECB #4. Failure to do so will prohibit future funding to this group by the UCSU Executive Council.
- SECTION 6: This Bill takes effect upon passage.
