BILL HISTORY

The American Indian Educational Opportunities Program at the University of Colorado at Boulder has received an award to sponsor an Upward Bound National Demonstration Project for American Indian and other educationally disadvantaged students. The emphasis of this 36 month project is to provide eligible students with developmental instruction in precollegiate science and mathematics. The program is in its third year of its second governmental grant. The Upward Bound Program at CU has been in existence for six years.

The project selects 75 students per year as participants. Each year the selected students participate in a six week summer institute which offers extensive and intensive individualized instruction as well as academic and career counseling. During the academic year following the summer institution, each student receives intensive follow-up instruction in his/her school. Students come from 17 different reservations in the western and midwestern states of the U.S.

Each Sunday the students and support staff have an afternoon lunch donated to them from various CU and Boulder community groups and organizations. In order to set a precedent for UCSU's participation in this highly successful program, we feel it would be beneficial for the student government and for the individuals in the program if we sponsored a lunch on July 20, 1986.

We plan to spend an hour or two with the students who are interested in learning more about student government at CU. All of the program participants are outstanding in academics and very active in their home high schools. They are excited about getting more involved at the University level. The director of Upward Bound feels that it would be quite useful for the students in the program and for students in UCSU who will participate in the evening. Not only will we be offering them a view of involvement at CU, but they will be given an opportunity to speak to us concerning problems that they have encountered at Native American and disadvantaged people in the United States.

Most importantly this event will serve as UCSU's first attempt at aiding a minority recruitment program at CU. As the Upward Bound project serves Native American people, one of the most highly abused peoples in the U.S., we feel that it is one whose existence is vital.

BILL SUMMARY

This bill shall allocate an amount not to exceed \$775 from Executive Council Discretionary Fund to go towards an evening with students in the American Indian Upward Bound Program. The amount shall include dinner for 73 students, 20 UCSU members and 7 support staff people. The dinner will be a barbeque including chicken, hamburgers, salad, corn on the cob, baked beans, bread, beverages and dessert. The dinner will be held on Norlin Quad. Immediately following the dinner will be an open session for an exchange of ideas between UCSU members and students from Upward Bound.

BE IT ENACTED by the Executive Council of the University of Colorado Student Union THAT:

SECTION 1: \$775 shall be allocated from Executive Council Discretionary Fund to go towards a dinner and workshop with members of UCSU and students from the CU Upward Bound Program.


SECTION 2: The \$775 shall be distributed as follows:


- \$7.75 per meal for 100 people
- Participants will include 20 UCSU members, 73 Upward Bound students and 7 support staff
- Meal includes (per person): 1 hamburger, 1 hot dog, salad, baked beans, corn on the cob, condiment tray, bread, beverage and dessert


SECTION 3: All UCSU members who eat with the Upward Bound students must fully participate in the planned activities.
