BILL HISTORY

National Alcohol Awareness Week at the University of Colorado, Boulder will take place on the week of October 20th - 23rd. The week concentrates on education about alcohol and alcohol abuse, with an emphasis on wellness and awareness rather than prohibition. Please see attached for schedule of the week's events.

UCSU, as the representative of the student body, should take an active role in educating the campus community about the largest abuse problem faced by students. In assuming responsibility for assistance with promotion, UCSU will be helping to facilitate a positive step towards eliminating the alcohol abuse problem on this campus.

BILL SUMMARY

Allocates amount not to exceed \$1,458.60 from Central Reserve towards promotion of National Alcohol Awareness Week, October 20-23, 1986.

BE IT ENACTED by the Executive Council of the University of Colorado Student Union THAT:

SECTION 1: Executive Council commit an amount not to exceed \$1,458.60 towards promotion of National Alcohol Awareness Week.

SECTION 2: This amount shall come from Central Reserve.

SECTION 3: This Bill takes effect upon passage.
