A BILL

BILL HISTORY

The number of students who are of color and financially disadvantaged is drastically decreasing at the University of Colorado-Boulder campus. The Affirmative Action Commissioner has traditionally taken on diverse projects which include: the creation of a child care facility; acting as liaison for non-traditional students; and the coordination of the Minority Student Forum. Therefore, more specific attention should be focused on the problem of decreasing numbers of students of color and financially disadvantaged. Through the recommendation of the Affirmative Action Commissioner and other student group leaders a committee needs to be established in order to deal with such issues. The Affirmative Action Commissioner's task has become too complex and she advocates the formation of this committee in order to effectively complete and begin new projects.

This committee is to be governed by the attached guidelines.

BILL SUMMARY

This Bill allocates an amount not to exceed ^{\$2,541.81}~~\$2,538.05~~ from Central Reserve to fund the initial budget of the newly convened "Action" standing committee.

BE IT ENACTED by the Executive Council of the University of Colorado Student Union, **THAT:**

- SECTION 1: An amount not to exceed ^{\$2,541.81}~~\$2,538.05~~ shall be allocated from Central Reserve to fund the initial budget of the newly convened "Action" standing committee.
- SECTION 2: The committee shall follow the attached guidelines.
- SECTION 3: The appointed Executive Council member shall give periodic status reports to Council.

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SECTION 4: Additional funding from the administration will be pursued.

SECTION 5: This Bill takes effect upon passage.

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COMMITTEE GUIDELINES

- a) The Committee shall be composed of seven members, with four members being appointed from student groups, especially one from United Mexican American Students, OYATE (American Indian support group), Black Student Alliance, and Asian Pacific American Coalition. One member shall be appointed from the University of Colorado Opportunity Programs (CUOP) and one member from Executive Council. The Affirmative Action Commissioner shall be the chairperson of this committee.
- b) This Committee shall be titled the "Action Committee" and shall be funded and empowered to address the concerns of minority recruitment and retention. This Committee will work in conjunction with the University of Colorado Opportunity Programs.
- c) This Committee shall further be empowered to delegate one scholarship of \$250.00 per semester to a freshman minority student. The scholarship shall be awarded only by a three-fourths decision by the Committee. The Committee shall begin accepting applications following the students' graduation from high school and shall be awarded on the day tuition is due at C.U. (September 13).
