BILL HISTORY

The CU Bowling Program is one that has not received a lot of attention, but one that is up-and-coming. They work independently but with a professional coach, and get no University or student fee funding in any form. Because of this lack of funding support for the team, they are forced to compete only with those colleges in the area (CSU, UNC, Metro, etc.). The team's only chance to compete at a national level is through qualification tournaments, such as the regional in Tempe, building the program, and be within the true spirit of student fees.
