BILL SUMMARY

The 1987 M.A.L.C.S. Summer Institute will be held on the UC Davis campus July 26 - 31, for students, faculty, and community members.

This year's one week session is intended to acheive four goals: 1) develop the research and professional skills of Chicana/Latina scholars; 2) encourage interested women who are undergraduates, graduate students, or sorking in academia to conduct research and writing on Chicana/Latina issues, needs, and interests; 3) provide information on the latest research on Chicanas/Latina; 4) enable Chican/Latina scholars who already have work-in-progress to move significantly ahead toward preparation of their works.

There will be five different types of activities during the summer workshop. Every morning, there will be five different workshops relating to academic/professional strategies. Tenatively scheduled are workshops in the following areas: 1) Dissertation Development; 2) Creative Writing; 3) Tenure Strategies; 4) Teaching and Curriculum Development, and 5) Persuing Graduate Studies. Participants may attend the same workshop all week long, or attend different workshops each day as desired.

Afternoon sessions consist of on-going research development on such topics as 1) Literary Criticism, 2) Women and Work, 3) Chicana Historiography, 4) Immigration/Migration Issues, 5) Women and the Family, 6) Women and Education, and 7) Women and the Arts. Participants are also urged to bring any work-inprogress that may be shared, discussed, or prepared during the stay at the Davis campus.

M.A.L.C.S. is affiliated to the National Association for Chicano Studies, which will hold its annual conference in April 1988, at the University of Colorado at Boulder. Since its incertion in 1972, the association has served to further the development of Chicano Studies by providing a forum for Chicana/o academics, researchers, students and community members.

Students attending this week-long conference will be introduced to a diversity of topics and issues that can prove essential in promoting the interest shared by C.U. Boulder of fostering a multi-cultural oriented presence in our community and campus. The students attending the Summer Institute would like to have a workshop in the Fall 1987 Semester that will orientate any interested C.U. student in progressive research methods and benefits.

BILL HISTORY

During the past academic year many inroads were established in the areas of minority awareness, minority recruitment and retention, and minority social and cultural programming. Integral in these efforts was the Black Student Alliance along with many other concerned students and faculty. In the coming months it is the goal of the Black Student Alliance to continue to build upon the cooperation and understanding achieved during the 86-87 school year. In furtherance of these efforts, the Black Student Alliance has scheduled a meeting and reception for July 31, 1987, from 7 pm to 10 pm to be held at the University Club. The objectives of this meeting are threefold. First, to strengthen the contacts between the several minority based organizations at the University of Colorado and key student leaders, second, to provide a forum for the Black Student Alliance and other minority groups to outline their goals and programs and to seek input with regard to the same. Lastly, to foster productive and lasting relationships between the University and members of the business community. To date the Black Student Alliance has received verbal commitments to attend from Governor Romer's Office, Mayor Pena's Office, Mr. David T. Goens, ESG., State Senator Regis Groff, Mr. Ken Hamblin, Mr. Perry Jones, and State Representative Samuel Williams. The Black Student Alliance will also invite representatives from Student Organizations, University of Colorado Administration and University of Colorado Faculty and Staff.

During the budget cycle for preparing the UCSU budget for 1987-88 there were significant problems in determining how the Local Schools Council would get money to allocate to student groups. After the Iran-Contra, Local Schools hostage-budget

crisis, the highly respected Finance Board agreed to suspend the UCSU by-laws, with the help of Executive Council, and allocate an extra \$5,000 to Central Reserve, with the idea that this money would be transferred to Local Schools Council Reserve after July 1, 1987.

Local Schools has proven, particularly in the past year, to be a viable source of funds for student groups and it is in the best interest of the students and UCSU to make this transfer.

BILL SUMMARY

This bill transfers \$5,000 from Central Reserve to Local Schools Council Reserve.

BE IT ENACTED by the Executive Council of the University of Colorado Student Union, THAT:

SECTION 1: That Executive Council allocates \$5,000 to Local Schools with the first allocation to not take place until September 17 when over-collections will be realized.

This is a proposal requesting funds concerning National Leadership Seminar for the Student group AIESEC - Colorado. The entire national staff hosts a delegation of 135 students which is comprised of two representatives from each local committee (generally members who have leadership potential and or have a desire to serve AIESEC on a regional or national level) as well as international delegates.

Issues such as CO2 build-up, Ozone depletion, climate changes, toxic-waste management, soil erosion, mass extinction, and tropical deforestation are ecology topics central to present political, economic, ethical, and environmental strategies; Dr. Myers is fully versed in all these areas and will cover them in his day workshops and evening address -- Global Ecology: Causes, Consequences, and options to Disaster. Dr. Myers is a very dynamic speaker who is becoming increasingly important to several of the world's largest development institutions. He is presently consulting for USAID, World Bank, and the United Nations. BILL HISTORY

A tradition was started two years ago when the Athletic Departments at both University of Colorado and Colorado State University came together and agreed to a yearly contest beween the two football teams. This decision was aided immensely by the state legislature, students and citizens of the State of Colorado. In its short two year history this contest has become an exciting rivalry especially with the victory CSU enjoyed last year over CU.

This year the contest will be held in Fort Collins on October 3, 1987. This is the Buffalos first visit to Fort Collins since the yearly matchup has been reinstated. Last year and the year before the Rams of CSU packed Folsom Stadium with crowds in excess of 35,000. Only Nebraska, Oklahoma and Ohio State accomplished similar feats. Thus, it is the goal of various officials within the Athletic Dept. and CU Administration to return the favor and pack the house at CSU.

A hugh advertising blitz will be underway shortly calling for students, faculty and staff to support the Buffalos and attend this game in Fort Collins. This Bill calls for UCSU to allocate \$1198.80 to a special events account designed to assist students in their transportation costs. Also, a committee will be formed to organize the buses, advertising and trip details.

Upon passage this committee will also research other funds from the Athletic Department, Administration and Student Groups to assist in transportation costs. The attached chart illustrates methods by which funds can be spent on buses and advertisement.

BILL ŞUMMARY

BILL HISTORY

The spending limit imposed upon candidates for office in UCSU elections is designed to assure that all candidates for office are given an equal opportunity to be elected. The UCSU election code is a document whose chief purpose is "to ensure equal opportunity and treatment to all candidates." (Article I, Section 2). During the last six sessions, party backed candidates have had a lock on the elections. This is due, in part, to the unfair spending limits which restrict the campaigning of independent candidates more than party backed candidates who are able to pool their resources and get more for their dollar. The following change in the election code would even out this unfair monetary advantage.

BILL SUMMARY

This bill shall amend the UCSU Election Code.

BE IT ENACTED by the Executive Council of the University of Colorado Student Union, THAT:

SECTION 1:	The following revisions will be added to the UCSU Election Code and the appropriate sections shall be changed.

BILL HISTORY

There has been much talk during the past year about how to make the UCSU election process more fair and equitable for all. This discussion has included as it's topics; the party system, the structure of the election itself, and campaign/candidate spending limits.

The spending limit debate has been of particular interest to eveyone, and indeed last spring this body approved a drastic change in the Representative candidate limit from \$250 to \$160. One of the major arguments against lowering the limit was that canddates would not be able to get the word out about the election to enought students and that voter turnout would suffer. This bill addresses there points.

In order that the trend in UCSU continues along the lines of fair play, and giving anyone, well financed or not, the opportunity to run for office, we propose the following.

BILL HISTORY

UCSU Executive Council and the University at large has taken a firm stand in opposing violence and harassment against women. It has actively supported such programs as NightRide/NightWalk, the Committee on Personal Safety, The Committee on Sexual Harassment and numerous educational programs on subjects like Acquaintance Rape and abusive Relationships. Facilities to improve campus safety, including the installation of emergency telephones and increased lighting have become a priority.
