WHEREAS: the UCSU actively worked for the passage of this legislation,


**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Executive Council of the University of Colorado Student Union, THAT:**


SECTION 1: UCSU will abide by the Colorado Open Meetings Law.



- Whereas: The University of Colorado has a responsibility to provide a safe environment for its students; and
- Whereas: A convicted murderer and rapist presents a threat to a safe community; and
- Whereas: Presently, the University of Colorado-Boulder is considering to allow Mr. John Auld, a convicted murderer and rapist, admission, work or social privileges on the C.U.-Boulder Campus; and
- Whereas: In 1971, he was convicted of raping and murdering a Colorado College woman, and was given a life sentence. On January 13, 1986, he was parolled, based on him being a "model" prisoner. One of the conditions of the parole was that he not be allowed on any campus within the state of Colorado without permission from his parole officer; and
- Whereas: Mr. John Auld is on parole until 1991. Therefore, he must abide by the conditions of his parole; and
- Whereas: We students demand a safe environment composed of responsible campus citizens; and
- Whereas: The presence of Mr. John Auld presents a risk to this campus's safe environment; and

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Executive Council of the University of Colorado Student Union, That:**





SECTION 1: Mr. John Auld should not be allowed to study, work or socialize on the University of Colorado-Boulder Campus

RESOLUTION HISTORY

A quarter century ago this country was plagued with loyalty oaths, blacklists, and elected public officials who ruthlessly destroyed people and careers in pursuit of their own political ends and guarding against an illusory communist conspiracy to destroy the United States. August 20, the Regents of the University of Colorado resurrected this grand tradition by moving to investigate Professor Edward Greenberg, chair of the Political Science Department, in lieu of reappointing him to his position. This action is a direct attack on academic integrity and an intrusion on the faculty's right to determine their own leadership. Even more shameful, this action was spurred by red-baiting on the part of reactionary right students; every student has the right to be heard by the Regents, but these McCarthy heirs receive preferential treatment not even accorded to those elected to represent students. Today we reverted back to when tolerance for alternative viewpoints was at its lowest point. The potential damage to the University is immense. Professors will not come to CU if the atmosphere of repression prevails, and it will become increasingly difficult to retain such distinguished faculty as Greenberg if the Regents persist with this outrageous behavior. Since the Administration is unwilling to challenge the Regents on this issue, the responsibility falls on the students to defend the integrity of this institution.

WHEREAS:	The Regents have acted in a manner inconsistent with the principles of academic freedom, free speech and faculty autonomy and;
WHEREAS:	The administration has failed to take a principled stand on this issue and;
WHEREAS:	This threatens the future of the University and the quality of education afforded students,




THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Executive Council of the University of Colorado Student Union, THAT:

SECTION 3: The above mentioned facilities will not only include access for the disabled to all University buildings but also include increased efforts to provide visually & hearing impaired students with the materials and certified interpreters they need in order to facilitate an equal opportunity to learn.





SECTION 4: UCSU challenges the University to equal our continued support for handicapped students in all areas of the University, not only in facilities provided.
