BILL HISTORY

The recent Student Assembly delineated many weaknesses in the constitutional powers and responsibilities conferred upon the Student Assembly. The following bill addresses some of these issues.

BILL SUMMARY

This bill shall place a constitutional amendment on the Spring 1990 ballot.

BE IT ENACETED by the Legislative Council of the University of Colorado Student Union, THAT:

SECTION 1:

The following shall be placed on the Spring 1990 ballot:

- A) Strike Article XI Section C of the UCSU Constitution.
- B) Add the following sections to Article XI of the UCSU Constitution:
- 1. 1000 members shall constitute quorum for the Student Asembly.
- 2. The Student Assembly shall establish its own bylaws upon convening.
- 3. Unless otherwise decided by a majority vote of the Student Assembly, <u>Robert's Rules of Order</u>, Revised shall govern the Assembly.
- 4. The Student Assembly shall be empowered to:
 - a) Amend the UCSU Constitution by a 2/3 vote;
 - b) Overide the Executive Veto by a majority vote;
 - c) Pass legislation by a majority vote;
 - d) Pass resolutions by a majority vote;
 - e) Legislation passed by the Student Assembly shall not be subject to Executive veto;
 - f) Impeach the Executives, member of the Leg. Branch, members of the Judical Branch and members of the Joint Boards of UCSU by a 2/3 vote.
 - g) The powers of the Student Assembly shall not be restricted by the Legislative or Executive branches of UCSU.

SECTION 2:

This bill takes effect upon passage.
