### BILL HISTORY

The Cinco De Mayo Celebration at the University of Colorado has been an important cultural event for all students on campus. On May 5, 1862, at Puebla, the Mexican People fought their first major battle against a French expeditionary army whose objective was to transform Mexico into a colony of the French Army. In this battle, the French were soundly defeated, due to the heroic resistance of the Mexicans against their national inslavement. In Mexico, Juarez took the stand of fighting imperialist aggression to the death. By 1867, Maximillian of Austria "Emporer of Mexico", was defeated and executed, bringing to an end a long and bitter war of national liberation.

In recognition of this historical event it has been a custom of the Mexican/Chicano people to celebrate the 5th of May. As conscious Chicano/Latino students we feel it is necessary to carry on this tradition on the CU Campus. Also this event will give the student body an opportunity to become aware of the Mexican/Chicano culture that exists on campus and in the Southwestern United States.
