BILL HISTORY

Russell A. Castro is a third year graduate student of sociology, who also did his undergraduate work in Boulder. He is a member of Alpha Kappa Delta, the national sociological honor society; and the Society for the Study of Social Problems. He is a graduate representative on the Graduate Committee of the Department of Sociology and recipient of a Doctoral Fellowship from the university. Mr. Castro has taught the courses Analyzing Society and Deviance in the last few semesters.

The paper which he has been invited to deliver at the Fortieth Annual Meeting of the Society for the Study of Social Problems is entitled "Support for a Faltering Flag: The War on Drugs as an Expansion of Nationalism and Bureauratic Legitimation".

In addition, Mr. Castro will participate in the annual meetings of the American Sociological Association, as a panelist in a discussion on "Longitude Research on Drug Use". Mr. Castro was invited as a panelist on the basis of his paper: "The Evolution of Drug Issues in the Press, 1985-1989: A Content Analysis". This invitation is considered a great honor.

Attendance at the Fortieth Annual Meeting of the Society for the Study of Social Problems will afford Mr. Castro valuable insight into the most current sociological research being conducted by influential scientists across the country and internationally, insight which can only be gained by attending a national conference. Through his active involvement with fellow students, both undergraduate and graduate, at the University of Colorado, Mr. Castro will benefit other students with his increased understanding of social movements and other sociological phenomena. Finally, it is highly prestigious, both for the University of Colorado and its student body, for CU students to present papers at this national conference. The Society for the Study of Social Problems is the second oldest and largest sociological association in the United States, and the process by which papers are chosen for presentation at its meetings is highly competitive.

The University of Colorado Student Union Legislative Council has funded student participation at the meetings of the Society for the Study of Social Problems for the last two years. (See 29EB#2 and 31LCB#4.) Mr. Castro is asking for less than half the amount awarded for this event last year.

A SUMMARY

To allocate \$176 from the Council of Colleges & Schools to partially cover the expense of a round-trip airline ticket to attend the Fortieth Annual Meeting of the Society for the Study of Social Problems, and the annual meetings of the American Sociological Society in Washington, D.C., on August 9-11, 1990. Mr. Castro is also seeking funding for other costs, such as hotel accommodations and ground transportation, from the Graduate School Dean's Small Grant Program, the College of Arts and Sciences, the Chancellor's Office and the President's Office.

BE IT ENACTED by the Council of Colleges & Schools of the University of Colorado Student Union, **THAT:**

- SECTION 1.** An amount not to exceed \$176 plus GAR from the Council of Colleges and Schools to a special events account in Russell Castro's name be allocated for travel to the Fortieth Annual Meeting of the Society for the Study of Social Problems in Washington, D.C., on August 9-11, 1990.
- SECTION 2.** A written report will be submitted pursuant to 24ECB4.
- SECTION 3.** This bill takes effect upon passage.




