A BILL

BILL HISTORY

The Midyear Regional Meetings of the Academy of Students of Pharmacy (ASP) are a major program for students sponsored by the American Pharmaceutical Association (APhA). The University of Colorado is within region 8 and this regional meeting will be held in Los Angeles, California November 9-11, 1990. The students of ASP have been working this summer to be able to attend this regional meeting. The meeting consists of open discussion of important pharmacy issues, seminars, career planning for the future, and most important, the finalization of policy proposals and elections for regional delegate and alternate. Elections will take place as well for midyear regional meeting coordinator for the 1991 meeting which will be held in Boulder, CO. The students of APhA are an important part of the policy making within the organization and cast a third of the vote in the house of delegates.

BILL SUMMARY

The bill allocates an amount not to exceed \$750 + GAR to help send 8 Academy of Students of Pharmacy members to the Midyear Regional Meetings in Los Angeles, California from November 9-11, 1990.

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislative Council of the University of Colorado Student Union, THAT:

SECTION 1: An amount not to exceed \$750 + GAR will be allocated from Council of Colleges & Schools Account for two round trip tickets from Denver to Los Angeles, California, for the Academy of Students of Pharmacy Midyear Regional Meetings.

SECTION 2: A written report will be submitted within 30 days of the end of the event pursuant 24 ECB #4.


SECTION 3: This bill takes effect upon passage.

Region 8 for ASP is made up of 7 schools of pharmacy from California, Utah, Arizona, New Mexico and Colorado.

The meeting started with chapter development activities so that each ASP group could see what the other groups were doing in areas of fundraising, community activities and other projects. A talk about how the policy procedure making of APha is done was presented. Presentations of the evening included Phi Lamda Sigma, a Pharmacy leadership honorary organization and the University of Pacific who reported on their project of providing information cards to residents of Sacramento, CA about the signs and warnings of heart attacks. The evening ended with a social mixer with food and lots of new friends.

Saturday's speakers included talks on the future of pharmacy and how to help impaired pharmacists and students. The business of drafting resolutions for national meetings was done with the group agreeing on three resolutions. The elections for new APha-ASP delegate, alternate delegate and regional meeting coordinator were begun with the applicant's being presented to the group. Saturday evening was left open with many of the group attending a Comedy Works theater.

Sunday's session was about Career Planning: Your Future Professional Role and covered many excellent ideas about resumes and interviewing skills needed to land the job you want. Closing business session finalized our resolutions for the national APhA-ASP meeting. Elections for officers took place with University of Colorado bringing home two of the three offices.


