A BILL

BILL HISTORY

The Council of Colleges and Schools has received referendum funds since Fall 1987 for the purpose of funding student group activities. This funding has proven tremendously effective in promoting student endeavors and involvement, while at the same time allowing Legislative Council to focus on issues of a university-wide nature.

The referendum question providing the Council of Colleges and Schools with income must be renewed. In the past four years, CCS has received 25 cents from each student every semester. This cumulative amount has grown from \$10,000.00 (the original amount budgeted to CCS by 27ECB#4) to \$11,500.00. In order to return to the \$10,000.00 range we propose a stipend of 22 cents from each student every semester. This amount represents a 12 percent reduction in student subsidy.

BILL SUMMARY

A student referendum shall be placed on the Spring 1991 ballot requesting 22 cents per student each semester to fund the Council of Colleges and Schools.

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislative Council of the University of Colorado Student Union, THAT:

- SECTION 1: Section 2 shall be placed as a referenda question on the Spring 1991 UCSU ballot.
- SECTION 2: "Are you willing to continue funding the Council of Colleges and Schools at a reduced rate of 22 cents each semester for the next three years? This represents a 12% decrease in your current funding of this account."
- SECTION 3: This bill takes effect upon passage.




