BILL HISTORY

Delta Sigma Pi (Deltasig) is a professional business fraternity for both women and men. With 225 chapters and over 150,000 initiates, Deltasig represents a dynamic fraternity with a tradition of quality and service dating back to 1906. **Delta Sigma Pi** holds a bi-annual national convention in order to congregate active members, alumni, and national officers. This event, the **Grand Chapter Congress**, is a conference that sets national goals and constructs the future of **Delta Sigma Pi**. This year the **GCC** will be held in <u>Washington D.C. on August 13 thru August 17th, 1991</u>. The week long event includes seminars on Officer Training, Professional Development, Fraternal and Ecumenical issues, a Career Fair, a National Candidate Forum, and some free time to enjoy the Nation's Capital. Skills returning to the College of Business are many and not limited to an augmented leadership and professional potential, amplified awareness of our Fraternities impact in the School, and pethaps invaluable business/political ties for the Business School.

BILL SUMMARY

This bill will allocate \$750 plus GAR towards **Delta Sigma Pi** and their fundraising efforts for the **Grand Chapter Congress** to be held in Washington D.C. on August 13th thru August 17th, 1991.

The excellence continues at the University of Colorado. On August 17, 1991 twelve students representing the local CU Business Fraternity, **Delta Sigma Pi** were presented with a National award of "Most Outstanding Chapter", the highest honor of the Fraternity. The business group was rewarded for their extensive efforts during the previous school year at the **Delta Sigma Pi** national convention in Washington D.C.

Competing against 227 international chapters of **Delta Sigma Pi**, the Colorado chapter, named **Alpha Rho**, achieved an excellent balance of social, professional, fundraising, academic, and community service activities to earn the award which places them as being the number one chapter in the nation. Sponsoring a "Bop 'til You Drop" dance-a-thon earning \$3700 for MDA and having professional speakers such as Juan Rodriguez, chairman and co-founder of **Exabyte**, discuss trends in the high tech industry contributed to the many events leading to this award. **Delta Sigma Pi** has initiated a scholarship for business students in honor of a Brother who passed away last September, along with launching a new chapter of **Deltasigs** at Colorado State University in Ft. Collins. Combined with social activities such as a St. Patrick's Day bash with other campus groups, **Delta Sigma Pi** has proven to be a well-rounded fraternity deserving of this National award.

Besides the National award, Grand Chapter Congress also offered the chapter a chance to shape the future policies of the fraternity. Over 50 bills and amendments to the By-Laws were passed as well as a Risk Management policy drawn up to support alcohol control, hazing, and sexual discrimination. The week in Washington D.C. also brought guest speakers and an Officer Training Class which will benefit not only the fraternity, but the leadership of the Business School.

With close to 100 members, **Delta Sigma Pi** is a co-ed business fraternity which has been on campus since 1926. It is an organization which offers all Business students a fountain of friendship and source of knowledge within the University of Colorado Business School. Other past awards include Most Improved Chapter for 1988-89 and the Most Outstanding Chapter in their Intermountain region of 5 states in 1989-90.

While similar to a social fraternity, **Delta Sigma Pi** offers not only social stimulation, but professional and academic attributes as well. They are a combination of all majors and areas of emphasis, undergraduate and graduate, within the business school.

The current officers anticipate that the Alpha Rho chapter will maintain its national status for the 1991-92 school year and endeavor to be more visible to our campus and community and contribute to the well-being of our Brotherhood.
