#### A BILL

Black History Month is an annual celebration of the contributions of African Americans to our culture. To commemorate Black History Month 1991, the CU Boulder campus is planning numerous events to increase people's awareness of the diversity of the Black culture. Some of the activities occurring during February 1991 include:

> "Pioneers of the West", an exhibit from the Black History Museum Paul Stewart, speaking on the contributions of

- the Black Cowboy "Sapelo--Time is Winding Up", part of the African Diaspora
- Philip Hart CU Alumnus speaking on "Flyers in Search of a Dream"

Artist Robert Colescott -- an exhibit and reception Harlem Caberet

Roger Smith -- "Frederick Douglass Now"

These are just some of the events planned for Black History Month. Some of these lend themselves to UCSU sponsorship due to their importance to the students. They are events that are free and open to all students, as well as the general community.

Philip Hart is a Professor of Sociology at the University of Massachusetts in Boston. He has produced many publications, is known for his work in the community and is also a film producer. Dr. Hart is a Denver native. He is a cum laude graduate of this university, the University of Colorado at Boulder. While at CU, Dr. Hart was a member of the varsity basketball team. He received his graduate degrees from Michigan State University where he was also a student leader. Dr. Hart is being invited to present his film on Blacks in aviation history - a topic that is educational and has drawn increasing interest across the nation. He will also elaborate on the topic through a talk and be available for questions. Dr. Hart's interest in this topic stemmed from his information about his great uncle, James Herman Banning, who was

the first Black pilot licensed by the U.S. Department of Commerce. Hart produced the PBS Film titled, "Flyers in Search of a Dream", which chronicles black pilots based in Los Angeles and Chicago and will be shown as a part of Black History Month. The showing of the film is scheduled for Monday, February 4, 1991 at 7:30 p.m. in the UMC Forum Room. The event is free and will provide some insight to an important part of history that may not be common knowledge to people.

The University of Colorado Student Union is committed to promoting diversity and is known for its support of Black History Month in the past. This is an opportunity to utilize the talents of one of our own graduates while providing some important information.

### BILL SUMMARY

This bill allocates an amount not to exceed \$2,500 + GAR to Black History Month.

BE IT ENACTED by the Representative Council of the University of Colorado Student Union THAT:

- SECTION 1: This amount of \$2,500.00 shall be allocated to fund the lecture by CU alumnus Philip Hart. The funds will be provided for honorarium. The film and talk will be one of the activities planned during Black History Month. Dr. Hart's talk and reception is free and open to all.
- SECTION 2: A report will be submitted pursuant to the event as required by 31ECB#4.

SECTION 3: This bill will be effective upon passage.
