BILL HISTORY

According to the CCS approved criteria for the Local Schools Fund Balance Petition, "Remaining funds will be allocated to the CCS account and can be assessed by each school through the regular process of a bill". We are requesting that \$996.00 + GAR be allocated to the Wardenburg Student Health Center to fund HIV testing.

Last semester saw \$4,727.75 allocated to HIV testing. Arts and Sciences Student Government gave \$2,000.00. Legislative Council also gave \$2,000.00. The College of Music Student Union gave \$150.00, and the Business Board gave \$500.00. The College of Music Student Union also authorized CCS to allocate its \$77.15 from the Local Schools Fund Balance. In the spirit of continuing the support that UCSU has committed itself to, it is only fitting that the Local Schools Fund Balance be used in this most productive manner.

We encourage the other schools with a positive fund balance and no plans to access the money to consider this route.

BILL SUMMARY

To allocate \$996.00 + GAR from Council of Colleges & Schools Account #1391200-Local Schools Rollover to the Wardenburg Student Health Center for HIV testing.

BE IT ENACTED by the Council of Colleges & Schools of the University of Colorado Student Union, THAT:

- SECTION 1: Council of Colleges and Schools Account #1391200-Local Schools Rollover shall allocate \$996.00 + GAR to Wardenburg Student Health Center for HIV testing.
 - SECTION 2: A written report shall be submitted pursuant 34CCSB#15.

SECTION 3: This bill takes effect upon passage.
