

A BILL

BILL HISTORY

Each school and college that makes up the University of Colorado at Boulder receives an allocation of \$1.30 per student per semester enrolled in that school (according to the UCSU Constitution.)

The Council of Colleges and Schools (CCS) received the fund balances from the schools after each fiscal year until it began its own referenda. The first allocation of the fund balance was distributed among each school. The next allocation was the "Local Schools Fund Balance Petition," which failed at its original intent.

The Council of Colleges and Schools has reviewed the options for the fund balances and offers the policy outlined in this bill.

BILL SUMMARY

The Local Schools Fund Balances shall be regulated by the policy set forth in this bill.

BE IT ENACTED by the Council of Colleges & Schools of the University of Colorado Student Union, THAT:

SECTION 1: Local Schools Fund Balances shall be allocated to a Council of Colleges and Schools Special Events account after the end of each fiscal year beginning after the 1991-92 fiscal year.

SECTION 2: Access to these monies shall consist of a "Funding Cycle." The fourth and fifth Council of Colleges and Schools meeting of each fall semester shall be when Funding Cycle hearings take place.

SECTION 3: The Council of Colleges and Schools bylaws shall be amended to reflect that members of the Council of Colleges and Schools shall be referred to as "Senator" from now until eternity.

SECTION 4: Each college or school is eligible to access these monies for "special events" as defined by the Council of Colleges and Schools. Schools and
