During the transition from the Associated Students of the University of Colorado (ASUC) to the University of Colorado Student Union (UCSU) in 1974, certain provisions were placed in the UCSU Constitution to ease the transition. At that time, these provisions greatly enhanced and eased the drastic change that took place in the structure of student participation in the university community.

Now, seventeen years after the transition, these provisions are unnecessary and only serve to clutter the Constitution. No change to current student services, rights or responsibilities would result from the passage of this amendment.
