A BILL

BILL HISTORY

Scientists throughout the country are voicing concern for the loss of biological diversity in our country's native ecosystems. Due to increasing demands for raw materials, non-sustainable practices are being used at an increasing rate which are threatening the ecological integrity of the land and water. Several coalitions in various regions of the United States have addressed the feasibility of ecosystem sustainability and protection in their specific regions. These coalitions have received both scientific and political support and continue to pursue biodiversity conservation within their region's native ecosystems.

As of yet, no regional coalition has been formed within the Southern Rockies region. In fact, the issues of biodiversity and ecosystem restoration and conservation have received only minimal attention in this region. The purpose of the Southern Rockies Ecosystems Conference, sponsored by the CU Wilderness Study Group, is to bring together scientists in the field of conservation biology, grass-roots organizers, and public land managers for the purpose of developing a strategy for conservation of biological diversity in the Southern Rockies. The Wilderness Study Group believes the conference will be an educational experience for all students concerned about the future of Colorado lands. It will be of particular interest to faculty and students involved in scientific research studies of Colorado lands.

The Wilderness Study Group has been quite fortunate to have such renown scientists as Michael Soule, George Wuerthner, and Allen Cooperrider agree to attend the conference without receiving any honorariums. The expertise of the scientists, wilderness activists, and public land managers participating in the conference will certainly make this a worthy expense for all involved sponsors.

BILL SUMMARY

This bill allocates an amount not to exceed \$1,200.00 + GAR to help pay airfare for the confirmed speakers.

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislative Council of the University of Colorado Student Union, THAT:
