A BILL

BILL HISTORY

5 The CU Flying Club has grown in recent years from just a handful of
students to a large student organization on campus. This year
alone membership has risen from approximately 25 members in
September, to 72 presently, and new members join every week. Our
goal, as defined by the club's constitution, is "to promote the
sport, safety and science of aviation at the lowest possible cost
to its members." In keeping with the "the lowest possible cost to
its members", membership dues are quite small. Therefore, the club
has inadequate funds to promote major activities to help accomplish
10 our goal. In the past, guest speakers have donated their time to
the club in order to share their experiences with our members.
Fund raisers have had little success due to the anti-solicitation
rules on campus. Therefore, we now approach the University of
Colorado Student Union for financial assistance in funding a much
15 desired, education based, club activity.

A Fly Day is an attempt to make flying more accessible to club
members. Flying is a rather expensive activity and as such, most
people never get the opportunity to experience it. On a Fly Day,
20 expenses are split evenly among the passengers of each airplane.
By organizing trips in this manner, The Flying Club tries to expose
as many people as possible to the world of aviation. However, the
trip to The Liberal Air Museum will be quite a bit more costly due
to the distance (aircraft rental costs are based on the number of
hours that the aircraft is operating). The consensus among the
25 club members is that the Liberal trip would be a great educational
experience, but is not financially feasible without addition
funding.

30 The CU Flying Club wishes to make a Club Fly Day to the Liberal Air
Museum at the Liberal Kansas Airport on April 11, 1992. The
Liberal Air Museum is a non-profit organization and is currently
the fourth largest general aviation museum in the United States.
The museum offers exhibits on the history of civil aviation and the
35 science of flight. The officers and members of the club feel this
trip would accomplish both our educational and recreational goals.

BILL SUMMARY

45 This bill allocates \$750.00 + GAR from Legislative Council account
#1391120 to help cover expenses for a CU Flying trip to Liberal,
Kansas.

50 BE IT ENACTED by the Legislative Council of the University of
Colorado Student Union, THAT:

SECTION 1: To allocate \$750.00 + GAR from Legislative Council
55 account #1391120 to help cover expenses for a CU
Flying Club trip to Liberal, Kansas on April 11,
1992.

SECTION 2: Written reports and editorials shall be submitted
pursuant 36LCB#20.

60 SECTION 3: This bill takes effect upon passage.


