## BILL HISTORY

The Society of Mexican American Engineers and Scientist (MAES) will be sponsoring its National Symposium and Career Conference in San Antonio, Texas, April 23-25, 1992 at the Wyndham Hotel. The symposium will feature career and technical workshops that range from interpersonal skills to time management. Along with the workshops the conference will host a career fair with representatives from dozens of major corporations.

The University of Colorado at Boulder chapter of MAES has recognized the importance of this educational opportunity and plans on sending fifteen of its members in hopes of networking and establishing working relations with other student chapters. One CU MAES member has entered a paper into the Technical Paper contest being held at the Symposium. Furthermore, we feel our presence will shed light on the University and its premier engineering school through our contact with engineering professionals, college students and high school students.

In order to reduce our expenses, MAES has decided to travel by rental van instead of flying. This will allow more MAES members to 20 benefit from this conference.
