A BILL

BILL HISTORY

In keeping with our objective of providing knowledge and awareness to students, we, the Drug and Alcohol Peer Educators at C.U., wish to keep the Designated Driver Program a growing and continuing part of the university and the surrounding community. The program is a commitment between C.U., local bars and restaurants, and the national organization, Boost Alcohol Consciousness Concerning the Health of University Students (BACCHUS). Our objective is to encourage students to think responsibly choosing a sober designated driver when returning from bars and parties and when taking road trips. The designated driver may receive free or discounted non-alcoholic beverages and munchies from supporting bars and restaurants. This year in promoting alcohol awareness during Spring Break, the Wardenburg Peer Drug and Alcohol Educators seek to incorporate the Designated Driver Program with a "Safe Spring Break" campaign.

Spring Break creates a party atmosphere. Many times C.U. students visit various foreign and local destinations to find more trouble than a good time. This year the Wardenburg Peer Educators wish to help C.U. students think about using responsible behavior by handing out the Designated Driver cards and Safe Spring Break flyers at the UMC loggia during the week of March 16th through the 19th. The Designated Driver Program carries over each year when the succeeding Peer Eds. take over. Our goal is to hand out the Designated Driver cards upon which students sign a pledge not to enter a car with a drunk driver nor to drive drunk. The card will offer the names of the over 21 participating establishments of the Designated Driver Program and the Wardenburg Drug and Alcohol Program phone number. We seek financing to place advertisements in the "Colorado Daily" including the dates of the loggia booth and the availability of the Designated Driver cards at the booth along with helpful Spring Break information flyers. We will also be sending out press releases. We will attempt to reach the entire student body population through the loggia table and outreach presentations.

This bill allocates \$374.99 + GAR from Representative Council account #1391121 to the Designated Driver Program of the C.U. Drug and Alcohol Education Program.

Driver Program.


55 SECTION 2: Written reports and editorials shall

SECTION 3: This bill takes effect upon passage.


