BILL HISTORY

This is the time of year when we remember old pledges and promises. Yet, as we get nostalgic, we must also prepare for the future. Student autonomy is always at risk. To ensure its continuance, we ask the Legislative Council to once again consider funding deterrent measures. Prevention is the key to many things, including the maintenance of autonomy.

At the same time that we consider our needs to maintain autonomy, we must also consider two principles that are basic in UCSU philosophy: recycling and patriotism. The United States Army is beleaguered with Apache helicopters that do not do the job of attacking Middle Eastern countries in the most efficient way possible. However, considering what CU Recycling can do with trucks, it is not a stretch of the imagination to assume that it can keep Apaches in fine working order. As well, investing money in the United States' government may help speed the retiring of our current deficit.

The Apache helicopters each come at a price of \$14,000,000 new. At the current depreciation rate, expedited by parts falling off of the helicopters, they should be worth about \$10,000 used. (This is the assumed "blue book" price after only one Middle Eastern conflict.)

BILL SUMMARY

The UCSU Legislative Council shall allocate \$30,000 plus GAR, to purchase three Apache helicopters from the United States Army.

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislative Council of the University of Colorado Student Union, THAT:

SECTION 1:

The UCSU Legislative Council shall allocate \$30,000 plus GAR to purchase three Apache helicopters from the United States Army.

SECTION 2:

One helicopter each shall be stationed on top of the University Memorial Center, Wardenburg Student Health Center and the Recreation Center to maintain a constant defense against an aerial attack of the University of Colorado Student Union.
