- "Take Back the Night" is a gathering of women, often supported by men, who rally and march against violence in proclaiming and celebrating self-empowerment and strengthen unity. Often, women share poetry or songs, written well in advance just for this occasion.
- "Take Back the Night" is an annual, national event, spanning close to 25 years now. The very central "speak-out" has been part of CU's campus for approximately 14 years.
- This year, due to some controversy in the year past, we are working extremely hard to sponsor a safe, peaceful and professional march.
- Raising awareness of violence against women and of the true roots of "Take Back" are forefront aims. We will be calling on more informed advertising and stepped up organization to achieve our

goal.

Once again we plan on marching through "the hill" area, Pearl Street Mall and the Boulder Creek Bike Path, the site of 7 rape assaults.
