BILL HISTORY

On September 18 and 19 a newly founded group, Campus Green Vote, will be having an electoral training for students from campuses around Colorado, Wyoming, and Montana. The training will focus on voter education and outreach on campuses, voter registration, and an education about student power in the political system. We are planning on having 50 or more students attend the training. Through the training we hope to have people return to their campuses with a better understanding of the political system and how to organize within it.

In order to put this training on we must have funds to cover travel, room, and board costs for workshop leaders, and travel stipends for students. We are asking UCSU to support student empowerment and unity by giving Campus Green Vote \$350 plus GAR. Thank you for your consideration.

BILL SUMMARY

To allocate an amount not to exceed \$350.00 plus GAR from Legislative Council account #1391120 to cover food and materials for workshop leaders and training participants.

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislative Council of the University of Colorado Student Union, THAT:

SECTION 1: \$350.00 plus GAR be allocated from Legislative Council account #1391120 to cover food and materials.

SECTION 2: A written report and editorials must be submitted pursuant 36LCB#20.

SECTION 3: This bill takes effect upon passage.




