A RESOLUTION

RESOLUTION HISTORY

Whereas: It is the policy of UCSU that all students be treated justly and without discrimination; and

Whereas: In the upcoming state election, the passage of Amendment #2 would Constitutionally deny equal protection under the law for gays, lesbians, and bisexuals; and

Whereas: The University of Colorado Student Union Legislative Council passed a strongly-worded measure, 34LCB#1, demanding that a "sexual orientation" clause be included in the University of Colorado's anti-discrimination policy; and

Whereas: The University of Colorado Student Union votes 3504-304 to include "sexual orientation" in its own documents, by adding Article XVIII to its Constitution in April 1990; and

Whereas: The passage of Amendment #2 would render Article XVIII of the University of Colorado Student Union Constitution unconstitutional;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Legislative Council of the University of Colorado Student Union, THAT:

SECTION 1: The University of Colorado Student Union Legislative Council reaffirms all provisions of 34LCB#1.


SECTION 2: The University of Colorado Student Union Legislative Council reaffirms 36 ER#101 in condemning any discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation.


SECTION 3: The University of Colorado Student Union Legislative Council strongly opposes the proposed Amendment #2.


SECTION 4: This resolution takes effect upon passage.
