Kappa Kappa Psi is a co-educational band fraternity that exists to promote the existence and welfare of the college and university bands of the world through service and recognition of dedication. The Fraternity was founded at the Oklahoma A&M University in Stillwater, Oklahoma (Oklahoma State University) in 1919. Currently, over 250 active chapters in the United States serve this purpose with several Colonies.

The Alpha Iota Chapter was founded at the University of Colorado at Boulder in 1931, and sits as one of the oldest chapters. Alpha Iota was one of only 5 chapters that remained active during World War II and served to keep the spirit alive during those tumultuous times of our nation. Recently, the chapter has commissioned noted composer Charles Eakin to compose a Requiem for Chorus and Wind Ensemble which premiered in March of 1992. This Requiem is the only one of its kind in the band medium. Currently, the chapter has assisted in recruiting efforts of the College of Music, assisted in the Annual Music Day Festival, provided receptions for most band concerts on campus, and is raising funds in order to endow a scholarship in the College of Music.

Active members are chosen from within the band department and all players are encouraged to attend annual informational meetings held in December. This past December, every player that showed interest in Kappa Kappa Psi was offered entrance into the chapter Membership Education Program. This is a period, during which, the prospective members are educated in the lore and goals of the Fraternity. It also gives them a chance to 'figure' out whether the Fraternity is for them.

The Midwest District of Kappa Kappa Psi is comprised of ten states including Colorado, Iowa, Kansas, Minnesota, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, North Dakota, South Dakota and Wyoming. Each year the Midwest District of Kappa Kappa Psi and Tau Beta Sigma have a convention at a campus chosen the year prior by the convention delegation. This year the convention is at the University of Northern Colorado March 26-28. Attendance at these annual conventions is vital to the continued growth and involvement of Kappa Kappa Psi and Tau Beta Sigma. In the past, it has been the Alpha Iota Chapter that has been involved in restructuring the emphasis of the District in matters such as music. For example, it was the Alpha Iota Chapter that pushed for the completion of the
