BILL HISTORY

For the first time since its establishment, the University of Colorado's Black Law Students Association (BLSA) would like to represent CU at the National Black Law Students Convention. The Convention will be held March 17-21, 1993, in Houston, Texas, and will attract BLSA chapters from across the United States, Canada, and Europe. Conference attendees are slated to include law students, eminent practitioners and legal scholars.

It is the goal of CU BLSA to establish a tradition of annual participation for the Law School at this nationally acclaimed convention. BLSA intends to send six representatives from its membership this year. Our goal is to raise sufficient funding to cover conference fees and travel costs in the amount of \$2000.00. Our request to UCSU is in the amount of \$750.00. We are conducting outside fundraising efforts to meet the difference.

In light of the University's attempts to diversify its student body, our participation will allow the Law School a higher profile within the African-American legal and academic community. This involvement will enhance our recruitment and retention efforts at the Law School.

It is our hope that next year CU BLSA will participate in the National Black Law Students Frederick Douglas National Moot Court Competition. We hope that continued participation will improve CU Law School's limited network with other minority law programs throughout the nation - a network which allows for resource sharing, collaborative work on public policy issues and increased recognition for CU Law School and its academic endeavors.
