A BILL

BILL HISTORY

2 The Cosmopolitan Club, also known as COSMO, has been bringing
foreign and American students together here at the University since
4 1922. It is the oldest student organization on Campus. COSMO's
purpose is to further international friendship. We have found the
6 best way to do this is to provide an atmosphere where people can
get to know each other as people, and not just nationalities.

8 In the past this has been done by having social activities such as
camping, skiing, potlucks, and hiking trips as well as parties;
10 and through cultural education, via lectures and slide
presentations. The scope and emphasis is determined by the
12 memberships needs and desires. COSMO is non-political, though it
encourages balanced, enlightened discussions on international
14 topics which may include politics.

16 COSMO welcomes any and all students and non-students to its events.
In addition, COSMO has no membership fees and nearly all events are
18 free. Almost all our money comes from either our agency account or
by independent fundraising.

20 Also, COSMO tries to show all sides of the American experience as
22 well as the International perspective. For this, we have been
trying to work with BSA, UMAS, the African Student Alliance,
24 Japanese Student Organization, APAC, Oyate, and others to bring
about more diversity to our agenda. This allows our non-American
26 members to experience the many traditions, heritages, and aspects
of America.

28 On Saturday, October 30, 1993, COSMO will throw its XVI annual
30 Halloween Ball. This is COSMO's biggest event of the year.




