A BILL

BILL HISTORY

The American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics (AIAA) is an organization dedicated to exposing its members to all aspects of the Aerospace industry. In this pursuit, the group offers bimonthly meetings with guest speakers from the field, social events, paper conferences, department information, industry tours, student/faculty interaction as well as field and organization publications. Overall, AIAA acts as an extension to students' education.

- On April 14, 1944, Martin Marietta Senior Engineer Robert Zubrin will present Mars Direct: A Simple, Robust, and Cost Effective Architecture for the Space Exploration Initiative. Mars Direct involves sending an unfueled and unmanned Earth Return Vehicle to Mars. The Vehicle produces a return propellant from Mars resources. Then, a second vehicle delivers the crew of astronauts, who explore the site, and return in either vehicle.
- Mars Direct addresses interdisciplinary concerns such as utilization of natural Martian resources, implementation of redundancies, the projects Lunar Applications, project costs, crew safety and scientific exploration. In turn, Mr. Zubrin encourages discussion and questions related to the project. This talk yields an excellent opportunity for students and faculty, from all areas of the university, to benefit from the lecture and discussion.
- Mr. Zubrin lives in Denver, so his travel costs and associated fees are minimal. The group will focus on advertising starting one month prior to the event. AIAA will provide pizza and pop to all those who attend the event, which will foster greater attendance and will allow an informal atmosphere for discussion. In addition, in appreciation of Mr. Zubrin's participation, the AIAA officers will take him to dinner at a local, moderately priced restaurant. The rest of the costs will be the audio/visual equipment rented from Academic Media Services.
