A BILL

BILL HISTORY

The UCSU Recycling and Resource Management Commission was created on April 6, 1989 to implement more environmentally responsible practices in all UCSU Cost Centers. Among the responsibilities of this position are the promotion of a 10% price preference for recycled paper over virgin paper purchases, the use of double-sided copying, the use of recycled paper in copy machines, and the development of a materials use and printing policy for all UCSU-funded posters. However, this position was left vacant for several months.

UCSU has been for years a strong advocate of environmental responsibility on the CU-Boulder campus and ought to uphold its reputation as a leader in this area. UCSU should be making its copies with responsible use in mind and should be taking advantage of the new technologies of voice mail and E-mail in much of its office communications in order to reduce paper use. Further, to maintain its role as an environmental leader, UCSU ought to take special care to post information only on paper that is readily recyclable on the CU-Boulder campus.

BILL SUMMARY

This bill defines paper use regulations and posting policies for the University of Colorado Student Union.

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislative Council of the University of Colorado Student Union, THAT:

Section 1: UCSU will continue to utilize the State's 10% price preference over virgin paper when needed.

Section 2: UCSU paper purchases shall contain 25% or greater post-consumer fibers.

42 **Section 3:** UCSU and the projects it supports shall use paper
44 which is readily recyclable within existing
46 collection capabilities and does not contaminate
the quality of recyclables collected on the CU-
Boulder campus.

48 **Section 4:** Copies for posting printed using student fees must
display the recycled appear logo, available from
the UCSU office.

50
52 **Section 5:** Copies for posting using student fees must display
the UCSU logo, available from the UCSU office.

54 **Section 6:** Postings made by UCSU shall adhere to CU Posting
Policy Regulations.

56
58 **Section 7:** A self-inking recycled paper logo stamp will be
60 purchased by the Recycling and Resource Management
Commission and attached to the UCSU copy machine in
UMC 333.

62 **Section 8:** Double sided copying will be done whenever
appropriate.

64
66 **Section 9:** Single-sided reusable paper will be made available
68 for use at the UCSU copy machine in UMC 333, and
should be marked "REUSED" on the unneeded side of
the sheet.

70 **Section 10:** Upon passage, this bill shall take effect at the
beginning of the 94-95 fiscal year.
