A BILL

BILL HISTORY

On October 26, 1995, 43 Legislative Council Bill #12 was passed establishing the Women's Resource Center (WRC), a cost center under the jurisdiction of the University of Colorado Student Union. Section 7 of the bill states that both the funding structure and cost center status of the Women's Resource Center will be revisited by UCSU five years from its creation, in the fall of the 2000 session.

On June 18, 1998, 49 Legislative Council Bill #4 was passed creating a dual reporting structure for the Women's Resource Center. This dual reporting to both Student Affairs and UCSU is to be revisited in the fall of 2001. During this analysis, the funding structure and cost center status of the WRC will be visited.

BILL SUMMARY

This bill is intended to save valuable student dollars by compacting two separate, but similar, studies of the WRC into one. Rather than have the Director of the WRC use valuable evaluating the status of the WRC as a cost center in 2000, then again in 2001, the Director will only have to do one report to UCSU in 2001. This evaluation will save time, money and headaches for the WRC Director, UCSU and Student Affairs.

THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED by the Legislative Council of the University of Colorado Student Union, THAT:

Section 1: It shall read in Section 7 of 43LCB #12 "The funding structure and cost center status of the Women's Resource Center will be evaluated by UCSU in six years, in the fall of 2001 session. During the course of these six years, options for integrating the Women's Resource Center into the University Administrative Structure and increased reliance upon general fund moneys will be pursued."

Section 2: This bill shall take effect upon passage by the Legislative Council.
