A BILL

BILL HISTORY

Accountability has become a popular issue lately. One way to improve accountability is to give students the opportunity to read about what each representative has been. This bill requires all legislative council representatives and senators to submit regular activity reports to e-time. As a result, students will be able to read these activity reports on the UCSU webpage.

BILL SUMMARY

All legislative council representatives and senators are required to submit regular activity reports to e-time. Failure to submit a report will count as the equivalent to a legislative council meeting absence.

THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED by the Legislative Council of the University of Colorado Student Union that:

SECTION 1: All representatives will submit an activity report to e-time during the same time cycles that executive staff members submit their reports.

SECTION 2: All CCS senators will submit an activity report to e-time during the same time cycles that executive staff members submit their reports. Included in these reports will be activities conducted within each senator's respective school.

SECTION 3: Failure to submit a report within seven days of the end of the reporting period will count as the equivalent to a legislative council meeting absence. Punishment will be assessed according to applicable UCSU by-laws.

SECTION 4: This bill takes effect upon passage.
