A Bill

Bill History

Currently, the UCSU By Laws call for 5 members to sit on each committee. To accommodate more members to have committee assignments, this bill changes that number from 5 to 7. Further, the Small Cost Center Advisory Board was created by 47LCB#4. This creation has never been effectively used. Its function is covered by the UCSU Executives and UCSU Finance Board chair. Any dramatic changes in cost centers that do not have joint boards are generally topics of broad conversation among all UCSU officials.

Bill Summary

This bill changes the number of committee members from 5 to up to ten so that more members of Legislative Council may serve on committees and removes Article V, Section B, 6 of the UCSU By Laws. Effectively, all members will sit on one of the two UCSU Committees except Legislative Council Leadership.

THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED by the Legislative Council of the University of Colorado Student Union, THAT:

SECTION 1: Article V, Section B, 4, a, of the UCSU By Laws be amended to say “up to ten members” instead of “five members.”

SECTION 2: Article V, Section B, 5, a, of the UCSU By Laws be amended to say “up to ten members” instead of “five members.”

SECTION 3: Article V, Section B, 1, of the UCSU By Laws be amended to strike “a Student Organizations Committee, and a Small Cost Center Advisory Board.”

SECTION 4: Article V, Section B, 6, of the UCSU By Laws be stricken.

SECTION 5: Legislative Council Leadership will not serve on standing committees. Legislative Council Leadership shall be defined as the Legislative Council President and Vice President (s).

SECTION 6: This bill takes effect upon passage and does not require Executive signature for enacting.
