This bill may be known as the Referenda / UCSU Ballot Question Act of 2000. This clarifies UCSU Referenda Policy on student groups receiving referenda money and their ability to use that money during UCSU elections. It is part of the efforts of 52LCB#6 and UCSU's strong commitment to cleaning up all internal operations pending possible Regent action on our student fee structure 15 March 2000. The potential significance of this day cannot be underestimated. Everyone within UCSU must do all they can to make sure UCSU runs as well as possible. We must; it is essential.

Bill Summary

Student groups receiving referenda money may use those dollars to pay for UCSU voter education events, publications and other items. They may not use referenda money for the endorsement or opposition of any candidate for UCSU office, or ballot question on the UCSU ballot. SOFO will provide primary administration of this rule.

THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED by the Legislative Council of the University of Colorado Student Union, THAT:

SECTION 1: Referenda groups may use their referenda dollars for voter education events including concerts, publications, fliers and electronic communications.

SECTION 2: Referenda dollars may not be used for the endorsement or opposition of any candidate for UCSU office, or ballot question on the UCSU ballot.

SECTION 3: SOFO will serve as primary administrator of this policy.

SECTION 4: Appeals will be directed according to UCSU policy, created as part of UCSU's Spring 2000 reorganization efforts.

SECTION 5: Legislative Council retains final fiscal authority over all referenda groups under the provisions set forth in the UCSU Constitution.

SECTION 6: This bill takes effect upon passage.
