A Bill

Bill History

The Legislative Council currently requires only two readings to pass a resolution. The Council’s consideration of a resolution is contingent solely upon a Council Representative’s or Senator’s sponsorship. A resolution represents a formal stance that the Student Union has decided to take.

Bill Summary

Because resolutions are formal statements originating from the University of Colorado Student Union, which claims to represent all students at the University, it is important that Council members choosing to sponsor a resolution be well informed about student body ideas and attitudes regarding resolution issues. A resolution’s sponsor is responsible for garnering student body support for any formal stance that s/he wishes Legislative Council to consider. 53 Legislative Council Bill #3 will help the Council remain accountable to the student body for issues and concerns the Council is considering.

THEREFORE, be it enacted by the University of Colorado Student Union Legislative Council, THAT:

Section 1: the Student Union believes that students play a vital and integral role in the Student Union and in decisions made therein,

Section 2: any individual sponsoring a resolution for Legislative Council’s consideration must receive 1,000 signatures prior to a resolution’s first reading,

Section 3: all signatures must be collected on an official Student Union petition and verified via social security and telephone numbers,

Section 4: on any given issue, no more than 111 signatures may be collected from any one specific school or student group,

Section 5: This bill takes effect upon passage.
