A Resolution Resolution History

On October 14th 2000 the University of Colorado Buffaloes hosted the University of Texas at Austin Longhorns in Folsom Field. During the half-time event a disturbance among the University of Colorado student section resulted in objects of various sizes being tossed towards the field and other students. The Longhorn Marching Band as well as the University of Colorado Marching Band were caught in this disturbance leaving students injured. As a result 4 students were arrested and 12 students were referred to Judicial Affairs. The outcome from that hearing could result in suspension or expulsion. The University of Colorado Student Union is in the process of working with University of Colorado administration to make sure an event like this does not occur in the future.

Resolution History

Whereas: The University of Colorado Student Union believes in holding students accountable for disruptive behavior, and

Whereas: The actions of the students displayed at the Texas Longhorn game reflects poorly on the University community,

Whereas: The University of Colorado Student Union is committed to finding a solution, THEREFORE, be it resolved that the University of Colorado Student Union Legislative Council, THAT:

Section 1: The University of Colorado Student Union issues a formal apology to the Texas Longhorn Marching band as well as the University of Colorado Marching band for the behavior of Colorado students at the October 14th football game.

Section II: The University of Colorado Student Union will work to ensure that an event of that magnitude will never occur.
