Resolution Summary

In our current day of age there are many barriers preventing a significant portion of humanity from achieving an elevated level of understanding due not necessarily by an individual lack of will, but to a systematic constraint on peoples in societies across the globe. In addition, the institutions provided for achieving the means to enlightenment are frequently utilized by governments and authoritative factions to render the masses incapable of understanding the oppressive grievances placed on them, therefore achieving a desired level of approval.

As the United States of America is viewed currently by many who conform to western philosophy as the most powerful nation on earth based on economic might therefore among the most "developed" of nations, the public system of education is ironically facing a severe crisis. Aside from the astounding dropout rates, the lack of federal and state support, the out-dated curriculum and corporate influence among other deficiencies, the system as a whole is inarguably biased to a historic value for European thought, culture and philosophy.

Resolution Summary

Whereas: Our nation's classrooms are failing to meet the advancement of society at large, in an era of rapidly transforming notions of what it means to be American.

Whereas: A nation's sense of self-identity is a reflection of a nation's ability to adhere to a system of governance that is inclusive to all its citizenship.

Whereas: We are no longer in an era where European values form the basis of a

dominant culture, therefore our institutions of enlightenment are outdated and pose a disservice to the current and future generations of students.

Whereas: It is no longer in the best interests of the government to utilize institutions of enlightenment as a device of glorification for the once perceived dominant European culture.

Whereas: Our future generations of scholars will better understand the nature of the <u>issues facing our</u> society if they grasp a true understanding of the history behind them.

Section #1 - This resolution shall serve merely as a proclamation, as this Student Union has no direct discretion over university curriculum. However this resolution shall urge faculty and staff to re-evaluate the Euro-centric nature of the academic basis by which the University of Colorado Boulder conforms to.

Section #2 - This resolution shall promote the seeds of a movement in departments campus-wide to incorporate a curriculum that is inclusive of achievement and historical events outside of the European scope.

Section #3 - This resolution shall set the wheels of a movement nation-wide in motion, to re-evaluate the nature of curriculums in all facets of enlightenment in the spirit of this proclamation.

Section #4 - This resolution takes effect upon passage.
