Bill History

Greenbucks is a program designed to motivate environmental volunteerism by rewarding volunteer efforts with a free ticket to a Greenbucks concert. The Greenbucks organization received referenda funding a few years ago and since the student group is no longer functional on campus, in August of 2001 Finance Board and Legislative Council approved the Environmental Center's use of the funds (\$14,000). The money is being used for its original intent, to encourage environmental volunteerism with the incentive of receiving a free concert ticket. The concert planning is now underway and the concert will be held March or April of 2002.

Bill Summary

Whereas: The concert will work best in a venue that will hold approximately 500-1000 people.

Whereas: After consulting with Program Council, possible campus location for holding a concert event would be Coors Event Center or Balch Fieldhouse. Neither of these venues are feasible due to the high operation costs (stage, sound, lights, equipment, and set-up) associated with them.

Whereas: The Boulder Theater would allow Greenbucks to hold the concert there for a price (\$2000) that would be within budget. This price includes venue, rental, security, and production costs. They will also provide promotional assistance at no additional cost thus lowering our promotion costs considerably.

Whereas: The budget of \$14,000 is based on the fund balance of the Greenbucks referanda account and is significantly less than previous Greenbucks bugdets.

Therefore, Be it resolved by SPECIAL ORDER by the UCSU Legislative Council of the University of Colorado that:

Section 1: UCSU Legislative Council gives the Environmental Center permission to hold the 2002 Greenbucks concert off campus.
