A Resolution

Resolution History

This is a resolution in support of improved bike facilities on campus. A priority bike project, deemed by campus planners as an important corridor for students, is an east-west bike route from Broadway through Main Campus on to east campus. Constructing this path would deter bike users from frequenting the pedestrian heavy dismount zones through Main Campus, and encourage alternative modes of transportation by reducing the need for automobile parking. According to the University of Colorado Spring 2001 Student Survey on Bicycling, 52% of CU students own bicycles in Boulder, and 70% of those students with bikes use them for transportation to school and otherwise on a regular basis. And according to the CU Spring 2001 Student Survey on Bicycling nearly half of students would use an east-west corridor built along Pleasant Street.

Resolution Summary

Whereas: transportation and mobility are a priority issue for students at the University of Colorado at Boulder; and

Whereas: the Campus Master Plan identifies many bike needs on campus that are not being implemented; and

Whereas: many bike racks on campus are dilapidated and outmoded in design. They can no longer accommodate modern bikes with wider handlebars; and

Whereas: there are many locations on campus where parking demand exceeds the supply;

THEREFORE, be it resolved by the University of Colorado Student Union Legislative Council THAT:

Section 1: The University of Colorado Student Union supports the funding of improved bike facilities on campus, including modern bike racks and the eventual construction of an east-west corridor.

Section 2: This resolution takes effect upon passage.
