Resolution Summary

The summary of this bill is to solidify that our main intentions are to focus on defining the housing limits. The purpose is to support reasonable zoning standards in Boulder. Furthermore, we want to work with the Boulder City Council to properly assign property rights which are to the benefit of all. Finally, we want to address this issue in conjunction with the permanent residents of Boulder to find a sustainable solution.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Legislative Council of the University of Colorado Boulder Student Government, THAT:

Section 1: The resolution supports modifying the current occupancy limits to more accurately reflect the living conditions of a given housing unit.

Section 2: The resolution supports fostering a more constructive working relationship with city council in the hopes that we can find a solution to this problem with wide ranging support.

Section 3: The resolution supports the efforts to change occupancy limits in Boulder of Boulder Choices for Boulder Homes.




